LETTER OF INTENT

Note: Use Times New Roman or Palatino 12 point on ALL Pirate Voyage documents.

Paragraph 1: Describe your general topic (music, car repair, etc.), explain WHY you chose this topic, and what you expect to learn.

Paragraph 2: Include the specific topic on which your paper will focus, some of the ideas you hope to include, a person you hope to interview, and other possible sources.

Paragraph 3: Begin with a transitional sentence showing the relationship between your paper and your project. Then describe your project: what will it be, who's involved, potential cost, how you plan to pay for those costs if the amount is over \$50, potential time spent (minimum 15 hours), and how you intend to document your time. You must also explain what you will submit for your project grade. (This is usually an item or a presentation/performance.)

Paragraph 4: Explain your understanding of plagiarism and the repercussions of such an act. You may, ironically, copy this paragraph from the example. ☺

Paragraph 5: Explain your understanding of the importance of meeting deadlines and the consequences of turning in late work. Again, you may copy this paragraph.

Sign your name and obtain your parent/guardian signature indicating consent.
